The business started in 2012 as a crafting and dyeing experiment in owner Bridget Henderson's kitchen. It grew organically from there and today we are a team of 14 women who produce high quality yarns for knitting crochet and crafting

Our yarns are locally spun from free-range South African wool and mohair, all mulesing free. And the team dyes everything by hand in our studio, using harvested rain water.

Our colours are uplifting. They have a lightness and brightness, inspired by the beautiful Cape landscape, our unique floral kingdom and life near Africa's southern tip.

We aim to infuse every skein with our abundant South African sunshine, and to bring this lightness and joy to our knit kits and patterns also.


